GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

Activities sponsored by an organization such as a church or student club must focus on secular community outreach projects, not on activities benefiting only the members of that particular group. Campaigning for a political candidate or party cannot be used, but voter registration and other nonpartisan activities are approved. Activities should be done after school and on weekends. If an activity takes place during school hours, prior approval must be granted.
